By the time you read this, I should be able to say; "have shot – will travel"



# **Director General Capability and Structure Integration**

Brigadier-General Basinger joined the Canadian Army as a Reservist in December 1985. Upon finishing high school he



entered the Royal Military College of Canada (RMC) Kingston graduating in 1991 with a Civil Engineering degree.

He has served with 1 Combat Engineer Regiment (Chilliwack, Edmonton and Croatia), with 2 Combat Engineer Regiment (Petawawa and Bosnia), and commanded 4 Engineer Support Regiment in Gagetown. He also deployed to Kandahar as Task Force Engineer and Chief of Staff for Task Force Afghanistan. Between Regimental postings Brigadier-General Basinger has instructed at the Army Tactics School, the Canadian Forces School of Military Engineering, coordinated exercises for the National Strategic Studies Program at the Canadian Forces College and led a seminar at the United States Army School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS). He was Commandant of the Canadian Army Command and Staff College in Fort Frontenac, Kingston from 2016 until 2018.

Brigadier-General Basinger is a graduate of the Canadian Land Forces Command and Staff College, the Canadian Forces College, and SAMS. Since receiving a Bachelors Degree in Civil Engineering, he has received a Masters in Defence Studies from the Royal Military College of Canada (RMC) Kingston, a Masters of Military Art and Science in Strategic Studies from the United States Army Command and General Staff College and is a member in good standing of the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of New Brunswick.

Posted to Ottawa in 2012, Brigadier-General Basinger has worked in the Strategic Joint Staff on Force Posture and Readiness, in Chief Force Development as Director Capability Integration, and in the Army Staff as Director Army Staff. From 2015 until 2018 he was appointed Director of the Corps of Royal Canadian Engineers. In March 2018, Brigadier-General Basinger was promoted to his current rank and assumed the duties of Director-General Capability and Structure Integration within Chief Force Development.

None of this would have been possible without the loving and steadfast support provided by his wife and their two awesome kids.

## Retirement - Warrant Officer Craig MacLeod

After more than 43 years of loyal and dedicated service to the Canadian Armed Forces, serving with the Royal Canadian Engineers as a Combat Engineer, Warrant Officer (WO) Craig MacLeod will retire on 12 April 2021.

Prior to joining 6<sup>th</sup> Field Engineer Squadron (6 FES), WO MacLeod served in the Royal Canadian Army Cadets where he received his Basic Parachutist Certification and was granted his jump wings. He also rose to the appointment of Squadron Sergeant Major for the 2573 Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps, the 6 FES affiliated Corps. At the young age of 17, WO MacLeod joined 6 FES, completing his basic training in May of 1978. WO MacLeod achieved the all important rank of Sapper in August of 1978 after completing his combat engineer training that summer. This was quickly followed by promotion to Corporal in November of the same year.

During his first few years, WO MacLeod was a section member with 6 FES, and was notably Sapper of the Year in 1978. He continued his climb through the ranks and was promoted Master Corporal (MCpl) in November 1980, having completed the Junior Leaders Course earlier that year. Four years later he was promoted to Sergeant, and four years after that to his current rank of Warrant Officer in 1988.

In January 1993, WO MacLeod was attached to 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry to deploy as a member of CANBAT 1 – Op HARMONY in Croatia. The deployment was from March to October 1993, and included the action known as "The Medak Pocket".



During those early years in March 1983 whilst training with 1 CER, a young MCpl MacLeod was described in a letter of appreciation, as an industrious, conscientious, and effective supervisor with a high sense of personal responsibility for the quality of his work. A statement that would define his career and be echoed by every Officer Commanding that had the privilege of having him supervise a task.

Upon return to Canada, WO MacLeod continued to serve with 6 FES, including support to the Canadian Forces School of Military Engineering on numerous occasions. Present for the stand-up of 39 Combat Engineer Regiment in 2008, WO MacLeod helped propel the now 6 Engineer Squadron (6 ES) to new heights, while also solidifying his legendary status in the unit.

WO MacLeod has served as Troop Warrant, Operations Warrant, Squadron Quarter Master and since September 2015, has held the position of Squadron Sergeant Major (SSM) 6 ES. In April 2020, WO MacLeod volunteered to serve on Operation LASER as part of the Canadian Armed Forces response to the COVID-19 Pandemic. While serving, initially as a Platoon WO and most recently as a Company Sergeant Major, WO MacLeod continued to fill the role of SSM 6 ES as well as take the opportunity to fill the role of Course Warrant on one last basic training course as lead instructor.

The halls of the J.P. Fell Armoury will be a little quieter upon his departure, and the work he does for the unit will have to be shared amongst many hands. WO MacLeod resides in North Vancouver where he plans to remain with his daughter and family as he moves on to his next bound. Chimo!
